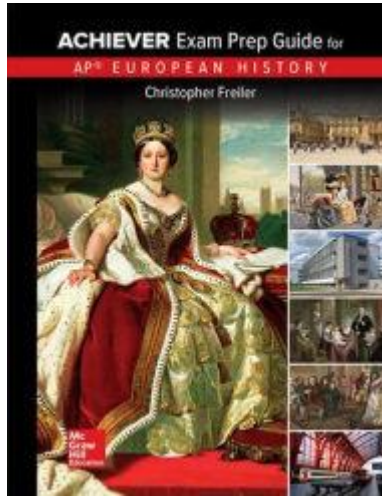


AP EUROPEAN HISTORY (11TH & 12TH)

Assignment:

1. Read chapter 1 (pages 1-9)
2. From chapter 2 read pages 56-62 (Start with the section entitled “A Note on Geography”). As you read, take detailed notes (at least 1 page front/back)

NOTE: This assignment will be collected on the first day of class!

Recommended Reading: AP European History begins around the 1450s. However, history does not lend itself to periods with clear beginnings and endings but rather a continuous cause and effect ripple. In order to be best prepared for our first week of study, I highly recommend that you read the following:

The Penguin History of Medieval Europe by Maurice Keen (You may purchase a used edition. I suggest a rating of “good” or higher; be aware of “acceptable”!)

Assignment:

1. As you read the book, create sample essay question for each chapter.
2. When you finish each of the four sections, select the chapter that you found most interesting. Write a two-three paragraph review of your selected chapter.
3. Once you finish reading the book, select the 10 most significant people of the Middle Ages and create a quiz; you may use matching, fill-in-blank, true/false and/or multiple choice questions.
